


Survey Summary


- The survey was conducted in October of 2017.


Is your primary residence in the School District of Maple?




Are you an employee at the School District of Maple?




Do you have child(ren) attending the District?




If you have school-aged children, what school(s) do they attend?








Would you support a \$576,000 operational referendum to maintain current programs and services for each of the next five years?











Funding Support

Since 1993, the State has capped the revenues that schools can raise. Under current state law, an operational referendum is required for the District to increase revenue to fund school operations.


